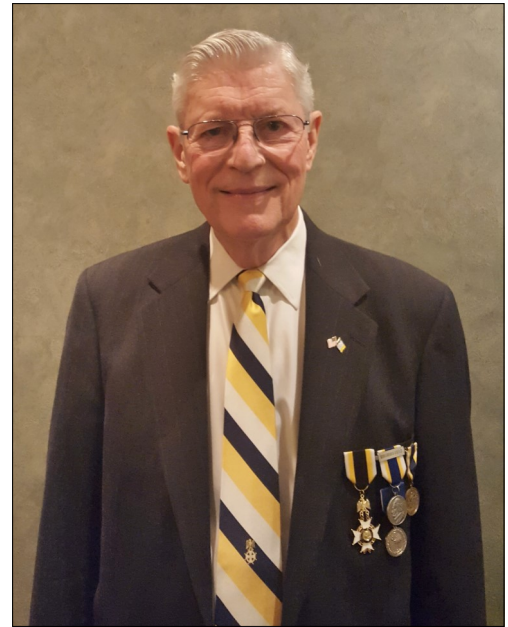
Compatriot John Slaughter presided over the naturalization of 16 new citizens at Kings Mountain Battlefield. The first time such a ceremony was held at that national site.

## Patriot Biography: Joshua Jones

Joshua Jones was born in Albemarle County, VA circa 1748 and lived around the "Pritties Creek" area. Between 1777 and 1778, Joshua, his wife Elender and their children moved to Burke County, NC. In April 1779 he entered into a 200 acre land grant on Gunpowder Creek and signed an Oath of Allegiance. He later entered a 100 land grant on the Middle Fork of Kings Creek Area of Wilkes County, NC in 1781 where he signed another Oath of Allegiance. Joshua was listed as being wounded at the Battle of Kings Mountain in Pat Alderman's book, "The Overmountain Men."

After the Revolutionary War, Joshua and his family moved to Buncombe County, NC where he is listed as having purchased 300 acres of land on 22 October 1803. This land ran along the French Broad River and Hominy Creek. He later purchased an additional 300 acres in 1810 and another 320 acres in 1819. Joshua continued to live on this land until his death circa 1839. He was buried on the family land. In total he and Elender had 9 children and numerous grandchildren.

The land owned by Joshua Jones was eventually incorporated into the Biltmore Estate in the late 1800's. The Daniel Morgan Chapter is in the process of planning an SAR grave marking ceremony for September 2017.
