Patriot Biography: James Thomas "High Key" Moseley

High Key was born in Brunswicke County Virginia in 1756. He migrated to South Carolina prior to 1776 because he married Nancy Anna Jasper in 1776. Nancy was the sister of William Jasper of Battle of Fort Sullivan fame. They made their home in Union County near modern day Pacolet.

High Key was an intelligence officer and food forager for Sumter's Brigade and was involved in some manner in nearly every battle in SC. There is a story told of him when he was hunting food one day and shot a deer. He was carrying the deer on his shoulders when some wolves smelled the carcass and started after him. He came to a creek and submerged the carcass in the creek and climbed up a nearby tree. He waited until morning and shot the lead wolf. They dispersed so he came down retrieved the deer from the creek and continued on to his camp. This story was retold numerous times and a woman located the tree and made a crude sketch of it and wrote the story on the page. This document is now in the Union County Museum.

High Key was a blacksmith by trade but also pulled teeth. His blacksmithing tools and his teeth pullers (most probably made by himself) are also in the museum.

High Key and Nancy are buried near the Pacolet River in Union County just below Grindall Shoals in the Moseley Family burial plot. He died in 1840. He was a widower for about eight years. They had eleven children. Some descendants still live in the area. --I am most proud to be one of them. He was my fourth great-grandfather.
